Program, Service, or Operation Requested

The MSCC Committee for the Awareness of Mexican American Culture (CAMAC), along with the help of MSCC Aggie Cinema, the TAMU Professional Hispanic Network, and the TAMU Hispanic Network, would like to host a yearly program to be held during Women's History Month. The proposed topic for the first program is "Bordertown, Women of Juarez." Topics for the following years will be chosen by the appropriate executive team and will focus on women's issues.

General Description:

In the past decade, over 100 women have been murdered in a series of sexual homicides in the border town of Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. To bring light to this issue, MSCC CAMAC proposes to show the 2006 film "Bordertown" in which a journalist investigates a series of murders occuring near American-owned factories located on the border of Juarez and El Paso. After the film, a speaker with knowledge of the topic would be open for Q&A. For the following years a women's issue affecting a different Latin American Country will be chosen.

How does this request impact students and what motivated this request (needs, strategic planning, etc.)?

This issue has been incorporated into one of our past programs: Dia de los Muertos; however, we believe that it is of grave importance and has the potential to be an outstanding program of its own accord that will serve around 200 students. Also, the creation of MSCC LEAF has motivated CAMAC to search for programs that could be tied in to the mission of both committees in order to work together for a common vision. Impact: CAMAC believes that by raising awareness of issues going on 'next door' students will become motivated in pursuing endeavors that will rectify the issue as well as become informed about international issues in general.

Have other sources of funding (fundraising, sponsorship, membership dues, etc) been considered? Please explain:

MSCC Aggie Cinema is going to fund the cost of the film and venue. The TAMU Professional Hispanic Network has agreed to pay for the cost of transportation and lodging for the guest speaker. CAMAC has also contacted TAMU HN, MALFA, and MALRC for help funding this program. Other possible sources of funding include the Hispanic Studies Department and help from other MSCC committees that would co-program.

CAMAC generally uses a survey as a means to evaluate a program.
